

The Government of Jersey requires organisations whose activities have 2 or more people to be within 2 metres of each other for longer than 15 minutes, to ask for contact information from students, for the purpose of supporting its contact-tracing efforts.

How will you be collecting my data?

At the beginning of every session we will complete a register.

What information will JRC be asking for?

At the time of registering/booking onto a course, we will hold your contact information.

What will you do with my data?

Data is stored in Accessplanit along with attendance, you can review this data by logging onto the Student Learning Portal.

How will I be contacted if someone has tested positive COVID-19?

That student will contact the COVID-19 hotline, the contact tracing team will contact the organisations the student had visited. The contact information stored for that particular session will be provided to the Government Contact Tracing team and they will be in direct contact to advise you further.



What if I don't want to give consent?

As of 1st December 2020, it is mandatory for all establishments to collect contact tracing data.
